

Zoom by Mobimex | Care instructions

Care of lacquered natural surfaces

The table top has been given three coats of two-component DD lacquer, and is sanded down after each coat has been applied. The lacquer is extremely knock-resistant and forms a protective film on the wood that repels water and dirt. Liquids such as spilt drinks, oil etc. cannot penetrate the wood. However, since the lacquer is harder than the wood, it may crack if the wood is struck hard and severely dented. The lacquer is resistant to ultra-violet light; this protective effect slows down darkening of the wood.

Subsequent care by the user:

The easy-care surface needs no subsequent attention.

Care:

Lacquered surfaces do not require special care. The table can be wiped with a damp cloth or cleaned with ordinary kitchen soap and water. Greasy marks can easily be removed using a strong soap solution. Furniture polish etc. should not be used.

Treatment of damage:

Damage to the lacquered surface (scratches or dents, gashes, stains caused by ballpoint pens, felt markers, nail varnish etc.) cannot be easily removed by simple means. The work must be entrusted to the ZOOM workshop, which will supply a quotation on request.

Suitable wood types:

All except Wengé, fumed oak and teak

Advantages:

- top-quality dirt protection for the wood
- very fine, smooth surface
- very easy care

Disadvantages:

- The wood loses its "feel" to some extent
- Damaged lacquer surfaces have to be repaired in the ZOOM workshop (but if the surface is of solid wood, this can take place several times if necessary without problems arising)
